

Please join us for a ride on county roads to visit local places of interest and end at Dog n Suds in West Lafayette. Allow two and a half hours for driving and stops along the fifty-five-mile route.

Start at Fairfield Lakes Park in Lafayette.

Note: Fairfield Lakes Park is located a half mile north of Haggerty Lane (County Road 200 South) on County Road 750 East or from the IU Health Arnett Hospital go south on Veterans Memorial Parkway, turn left at the stop sign for Haggerty Lane, going past the National Guard Armory, crossing over Interstate 65 and Wildcat Creek then, immediately turn left onto County Road 750 East.

Turn right (south) onto County Road 750 East when leaving the parking lot. Turn left onto County Road 200 South, this becomes County Road County Road 700 North.

Turn left onto County Road 600 West crossing over Indiana 26 and then, a two-span concrete arch bridge (built 1932) over Campbell’s Run then, another short bridge over the Middle Fork of the Wildcat Creek. Road then becomes County Road 500 West in Carroll County. Cross over US 421 then, right on County Road 600 South.



Lancaster (Beard) Covered Bridge, Owasco

Turn left onto County Road 500 West. Head north onto County Road 500 West to Lancaster bridge.

Stop at Lancaster covered bridge for ten minutes.

Turn right onto County Road 500 South then, turn right onto Prince William Road. (Prince William Road went to Prince William, a town that no longer exists.)



Xenia Iron Bridge, Ockley

Stop at Xenia Iron Bridge for ten minutes.

Turn left onto County Road 600 South, continue to Indiana 75 and turn left.



Adams Mill, Cutler

As highway starts to veer left go straight onto Meridian Road into Cutler.

Turn right onto County Road 500 South, then left onto County Road 75 East. Continue on to the covered bridge further up the road.



Adams Mill Covered Bridge, Cutler

Stop at Adams Mill Bridge for ten minutes.

Continue to Delphi: Road becomes County Road 50 East. Turn left onto County Road 400 South then, at Indiana highway 75 turn right, less than a mile to County Road 300 South then, turn left. Continue to Prince William Road and turn right.



Carroll County Courthouse, Delphi

Turn right onto Indiana 39 North, continue straight on Washington Street into Delphi, and left at Franklin Street, a block after the traffic light.

Continue several blocks, over railroad tracks then, turn left into CVS Parking lot (note: McDonald’s located next door), rest stop.



Bicycle Bridge Road, Battle Ground

Continue to Battle Ground: Turn right onto Indiana 18, bear right at light, and turn left onto Bicycle Bridge Road. Turn left onto Springboro Road/Tyler Road. Turn right onto Pretty Prairie Road and continue into Battle Ground.



Prophet’s Rock, Battle Ground

Cross railroad tracks and turn left onto Railroad Street, turn right onto Prophet Street then, turn right onto County Road 600 North and continue through the stop light.

Continue to Dog N Suds: Cross over Interstate 65 then, turn left onto County Road 75 East continuing south, road

becomes Old Soldiers Home Road.
Continue into West Lafayette, crossing over
Sagamore Parkway. Turn left at stop sign
onto Happy Hollow Road.



Dog n Suds, West Lafayette

Turn right onto Chippewa Street then, turn
right on Navajo Street. Turn right onto
Nighthawk Drive then, left to Dog n Suds.

The Questers is a non-profit international
organization. It was founded in 1944 by
Jessie Elizabeth Bardens in Pennsylvania and
has grown to about 12,500 members
throughout the United States and Canada.
Its purpose is to encourage an appreciation
of antiques, and the preservation and
restoration of historical landmarks.

Adams Mill will be open April 16th through
October 16th, 2016, Saturday & Sunday, 1-5
p.m. We will be there when it is open!!
Current planned time at the mill is 20
minutes. This is a grist mill that was
operational until 1951. Located at this site
due to the oxbow path of the Wildcat Creek.
This shortened the path of water flow to
200 yards, though distance by the creek is
almost a mile.

Lancaster Covered Bridge, a Howe-truss
design, was built in 1872, rebuilt in 1972,
1981, and 2006. Spans Wildcat Creek for
128 feet. Named for a nearby community.
Also known as Beard’s Bridge, a nearby land
owner.

Adams Mill Covered Bridge, named after
Adams Mill (from John Adams), also a
Howe-truss design, was built in 1872.
Bridge was restored and open to traffic in
1999.

Both bridges were built for \$12,237 by the
Wheelock Bridge Company.

Xenia bridge was not originally built at
current location. Originally riveted
together, now bolted after the move.
Where did it come from?
